You will also receive strength based descriptive feedback and an area of growth in the written comments.

Little Red Fridge

At Davis Bay we are excited to be launching two new programs: a stocked fridge and a breakfast program! Food is an essential tool for learning. We are working towards providing Grab and Go breakfast items and *I will communicate back to families when that program is up and running*. Beginning this week, we are stocking the *new red mini fridge with yummy items for anyone who is hungry to access food*. Research shows that asking for food is a big barrier for learners. Being well fed with nutritious food helps improve focus, concentration, and emotional self-regulation. If a child comes home with food in their lunch kit and are accessing school food – please chat with them! We don't have time to find out why children aren't eating what is in their lunch kits - we are just happy to know that a hungry child has eaten something. In a nutshell, anyone who is hungry will have something to eat.

We are working getting a coordinator who will be facilitating and coordinating volunteers. Volunteers will be needed to help with baking, serving, clean up etc. as the coordinator role has limited capacity and we hope to build a program that can move forward beyond this year. Please let me know if you have questions.

NEW BUSINESS (PAC chair) BCCPAC:

BCCPAC is the BC Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils. BCCPAC advocates on behalf of all public-school families and provides guidance and support to PACs, DPACs and individual parents across the province. BCCPAC's mandate is extensive and membership fees are an important source of revenue to support our activities. BCCPAC sits at the "provincial table" with the Ministry of Education and Child Care and other education partners, representing parents on all issues relating to education, as guided by our members.

Cost to join is \$75/year. DBES hasn't been a member but a few other schools in the district and the DPAC are members. Benefits include workshops on how to run the PAC. Treasurer training, the ins and outs of gaming grants etc. It seems to be a wealth of information. They are also a way to have our concerns at the table at the provincial level.

Website Update:

<u>davisbaypac.com</u> is up and running. Jana is still learning the platform but fundraiser information, forms dates and a few events are now up. Needs some new photos and icons, but ultimately functional.

Cost for 3 years domain (with tax): \$88.91

Cost for a year hosting with Wix (with tax): 100.80

This is within the budget allotted for the site. Ongoing fees will be about \$100 a year with more when the domain renews (approx. \$130/year for budget purposes).

Jana can handle renewal and updating until May 2024 when she graduates out.

Jana wants to work on: a 'Greenhouse' section, 'Calendar' section and possibly an 'Archive" section for minutes and budgets.

NEW PLATFORM just launched: *K12 Lunches Inc* is a few online software fundraising platforms that is a simple lunch fundraising platform. No registration, licensing or membership fees. It charges 1% of the transactions that is passed to parents. No need for a separate merchant account. It can also handle other fundraising activities outside of lunches. <u>https://www.k12lunches.com/register</u>
